Topics covered will include: mapping soil pH, treating soil acidity, lime rates and quantity needed to address soil acidity.

Potato Weed

Heliotrope is a summer sowing annual herb that thrives on disturbed, bare or open, cultivated ground.

Following these early Summer rains, now is the time to be vigilant with Stock that maybe exposed to *Common Heliotrope* or Potato Weed resulting in severe toxicity primarily to sheep.

This annual herb contains toxins known as pyrrolizidine alkaloids which is present at all stages of growth and in all parts of the plant, including the seed, that damage livestock's liver along with Photosensitisation (reddening or scabs on the ears, muzzle or other wool-free areas) is common if affected sheep are grazing green pasture.

In addition to the direct effects of heliotrope, there are secondary effects including pregnancy toxaemia, copper poisoning and ammonia poisoning.

Liver damage caused by heliotrope leads to an abnormally high uptake of copper by the liver, especially when sheep are grazed on clovers or medics which have a high copper content this Copper poisoning causes sudden death, with jaundice, when the sheep are stressed.

Livestock tend to avoid eating heliotrope if other feed was available, because heliotrope is relatively unpalatable, however as stubble supplies reduce, Sheep may be more inclined to eat potato weed if ad-lib hay and grain is not available. Minimise the exposure of stock and the feeding of a high energy - low protein grain diet (e.g. *barley, wheat or oats, but not peas or lupins*) and a reduction in stress, will also minimise problems with pregnancy toxaemia and ammonia poisoning.
